

THE LONGER-TERMS AIMS FOR THE WORLD HERITAGE SITE

Change is rapid and constant, and difficult to predict. Nevertheless, looking forward ten years, to 2025, the following aims should be kept in mind:

- The introduction and maintenance of a sustainable model for the funding and resourcing of the coordination and management of activity for and within the World Heritage Site (WHS).
- The strengthening of the identity, location and content of the WHS.
- Deeper and wider community involvement and participation in the maintenance and enhancement of the Outstanding Universal Value (OUV) of the WHS.
- The embedding of the benefits of WHS status in the prosperity of the region.
- Revision of the boundary of the WHS to include more comprehensively the known remains of the Roman frontier, if this can be done without a new nomination.
- The raising of public consciousness, among visitors and residents, of the international and cross-cultural dimensions of the Frontiers of the Roman Empire WHS, and the recognition of the common heritage that binds us together.
- The maximising of sustainable access to and within the WHS without compromising its OUV.
- The achievement and maintenance of the highest standards in the conservation of the remains of the Roman frontier.
- The maintenance, enhancement, and continual refreshment of the information and interpretation made available to the public.
